MINUTES OF LOCAL 696
GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

May 16, 2024

Meeting called to order 6:20 PM by President Dinkins

President Dinkins recognized members first time attending a general membership meeting by asking them to stand.

President Dinkins asked if everyone had a chance to read the minutes and financial report.

President Dinkins then asked if there was a motion to accept the minutes of the last general membership meeting. Brother Jerome Brisbon made a motion to accept the minutes as written. Sister Aurellia Harrell seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

President Dinkins then asked if there was a motion to accept the financial report. Sister Fatina El made the motion to accept the financial report. Sister Mary Kachline seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

President Dinkins explained to the membership how the run-off election works, he then explained, why and how we have a run-off election for Steward/Delegate.

President Dinkins then asked the two candidates to stand, President Dinkins then announced the two candidates as Evelyn Flint from the Free Library and Deanna Jones from the Department of Revenue.

President Dinkins then stated the importance of getting your mail-in run-off ballots back in the mail on time.

Brother Matt Catron stated a new rule has been inserted into the voting process, Brother Catron explained that you can also pick up a ballot at the American Arbitration Association (AAA)@ 230 S Broad St.

President Dinkins clarified the new rule that was inserted into the voting process.

Sister Sharon Thorpe asked for clarity, and Sister Funches repeated and explained the process again.

President Dinkins addressed an issue pertaining to District Council 33 apparel distribution. President Dinkins stated that those apparel items were distributed prematurely and has since been ceased; the official distribution date will be released to the membership in the near future.

President Dinkins reminded the membership that the notice for general membership meetings is on the Local 696 Calendar. President Dinkins expressed the notice that is sent in the mail is just a reminder to attend the general membership meeting.

Sister Aileen Haggerty asked if the calendars could be emailed.

President Dinkins responded by saying yes the calendars can be emailed, President Dinkins stated that he will make sure that anyone who does not have a calendar or would like to receive one, can leave their personal email address to receive a calendar.

Brother Dan suggested giving the calendars out at new employee's orientation.

President Dinkins responded saying we always give the calendars out at new employee's orientations.

Sister Roxanne Huff- Gross thanked President Dinkins for stopping by their site speaking to the employees, and explaining the voting process.

Brother Shelton asked President Dinkins if he could let the work sites know of his anticipated visit, so that more members can be onsite at the times of his arrival.

President Dinkins introduced District Council 33 Interim President Omar Salaam.

President Salaam thanked Local 696 for their support in the past and upcoming District Council 33 Election. President Salaam spoke on the importance of the election and his team's goals for the future if elected. President Salaam also clarified the amount of Dorney Park tickets each member could purchase.

Sister Evelyn Flint asked about the upcoming District Council 33 Library and if it was done? Sister Flint also asked if they need volunteers. President Dinkins stated that he will find out.

Brother David Holley asked about safety for the Municipal Guards and the opening of branches without the proper amount of guard on site.
